
RESCUED FROM MINE.

TWO MEN WHO WERE IMPRISONED
FOR THIRTEEN DAYS.

Leadville, Col., March 23.—At 11 o'clock last night the two mine pump men, Charles Reuss and Bert Froy, who were imprisoned in the Bon Air mine thirteen days ago, were found by the rescuers and restored to their friends. They show little effect of their experience.

They were on the 430 foot level when a cave-in near the top shaft cut them off from the outer world.

Fortunately the big water pipe was not broken and by blowing a hole in it with dynamite the men were able to communicate with their friends, who kept them supplied with food, while a new shaft over 200 feet deep was sunk. The cost of rescuing the men has been over \$3,000.
