

Three Youths Lost in Mine Are Rescued

EAST LIVERPOOL, Ohio (AP)—Three young men were rescued today from an abandoned clay mine in the hills one mile west of here after being lost about 15 hours.

They are Ed Unger, 16; Lemoyne Simms, 19, and his cousin, James Simms, 23, all of East Liverpool.

They had gone into the mine on an exploration expedition late yesterday with three other youths—Larry Virden, Tom Kiger and Roy Sablack. The latter three came out last night.

A searching party of about 50 police, firemen and civilian defense personnel was organized early today when it was reported Unger and the Simms cousins had not returned to their homes. The trio was found unharmed about five hours later two miles from the mine entrance.

"They were about as far back as they could go," said Patrolman Richard Emmerling, a member of the group that found the trio.

James Simms said the three got separated from their companions in the maze of tunnels and soon realized they were lost. With only one flashlight among them, they decided to stay where they were until someone came for them, he said.

"We walked around most of the night to keep warm," Simms said.
