MAHANAY CITY, Pa., Oct. 7.—After having suffered the awful agony of a living tomb for eight hours, Charles Rineavage was rescued from Tunnel Ridge mine, where he had been imprisoned behind hundreds of tons of fallen coal. His companion, Joseph Skernolis, was swept into a breast, where he lies dead, asphyxiated by the poisonous gases.
