

## 1 Drowned, 2 Saved in Mine Flood

TAMAQUA, Pa., July 26.—As the result of a rush of water down a chute in a local mine today, Palmer Jones, 19 years old, a laborer, was killed, and Peter McHugh and John Smith were imprisoned in the chute two hours until released, uninjured. Jones had his foot caught by a plank and was forced to stand in a car, which he was about to load, while the water slowly mounted as high as his head. He was smothered before help could reach him.
