
ONE MAN RESCUED FROM A BURNING COAL MINE.

McAlester, Okla., Dec. 30.—After having been entombed for twenty-eight hours in a smoke-filled cut of the Bolen Darnell Company's Coal mine, Superintendent John Brown was rescued alive but unconscious, this morning. Brown would have died within another hour, but as it is his condition is serious.

Brown risked his life in a heroic endeavor to rescue Angelo Ascinar, a shot firer, who was entombed following an explosion in the mine late Tuesday.

The shot firer's fate still remains unknown.
