

## REWARD FOR BOY HERO.

### He Saved Many From Death in a Mine Fire.

M'ALESTER, Okla., Feb. 24.—As a reward for his bravery in warning miners at work in mine No. 5 of the Western Coal & Iron Company at Lohigh, Okla., when fire broke out in the mine last Thursday, resolutions were adopted at the convention of the United Mine Workers of America of the twenty-first district today, authorizing the executive board to set aside sufficient funds to defray the expenses of educating Reifne Rodriguez, A Mexican youth.

When it was discovered that the mine was afire, Rodriguez ran through the workings shouting a warning to the workmen. As a result, all of the 100 men at work, with the exception of nine, escaped before the fire gained headway.
