

## Six Saved From Death in Mine

LAS VEGAS, Nev., Dec. 5.—(UP)—Two hundred and fifty lead miners, digging in two-minute shifts through hundreds of tons of rock choking a tunnel 700 feet below ground, today rescued the last of six men entombed by a cavein.

The last three were brought up shortly after noon from the Pioche mine, No. 3, 180 miles north of here on the Nevada desert, where a cavein caught them last night.

Only one, Sam Boschier, hurled to his chin in broken rock, was injured. One of his arms and four of his ribs were broken.

Three men were found, uninjured, during the night, and rescuers dug on into the slide, which filled 150 feet of a steeply sloping mine tunnel with rock and earth.
