

2 injured in Western Pa. mine collapse

KITTANNING (AP) — Authorities say two people have been rescued after a coal mine collapse in western Pennsylvania.

The collapse happened Monday afternoon at the Tracy Lynne mine operated by Rosebud Mining of Kittanning. That's about 40 miles northeast of Pittsburgh.

The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection confirms that there were two injuries.

Rick Murphy of the state Bureau of Mine Safety says the two miners are being taken to a hospital, including one with a possible knee injury. The injuries are not believed to be life-threatening.

The miners were brought to the surface just after 6 p.m. after a rescue effort that began about an hour earlier.

State and federal mine officials are investigating.
