

Employes of the G. B. Markle and Co.'s mine at Jeddo have been working in relay shifts all day to reach Michael Lebon, the entombed miner, who was hemmed in the mines yesterday afternoon by a squeeze.

The night shift were on their work last evening when the cave came. There were eight in the party and all succeeded in making their escape but Lebon. He somehow separated from the others and a second fall caught him in a cave and in an instant tons of rock and coal had the unfortunate man hemmed in.

The wind occasioned by the cave was so great that the men were knocked down and were more or less injured.

An investigation was made by the officials of the mine immediately and when they learned that Lebon was entombed they at once started to rescue the prisoner. Last night it was thought he had been killed, but this afternoon the rescuers were rewarded by hearing the miner directing them how and where to dig. Although he is still alive it is believed that he is badly injured. They expect to reach him this evening.

A dispatch from Hazleton this afternoon says that Michael Lebon was rescued alive and unhurt by the rescuing party. He was running away from the cave-in when the big fall came. A large piece of the room fell directly in front of him and behind.

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
