

Rescue Two Miners Buried Two Hours Under Roof Fall At No. 6; One Man Killed

A fall of roof shaken loose by the crashing of a runaway mine trip at No. 6 Colliery, Jermyn-Green Coal Company last night instantly killed a Duryea miner and buried two other No. 6 mine workers under a pile of debris for two hours before they were rescued by fellow workers.

One of the trapped men is a patient in Pittston Hospital.

Andrew Swierczenski, 154 York avenue, Duryea, was the miner and was instantly killed at about 8 o'clock when the accident occurred. His buddy, Frank Chas, 45, of 488 Main street, Sebastopol, received lacerations of the scalp, brush burns of the back and legs. He was admitted to Pittston hospital at 10:10 and his condition today is reported as good.

The second man rescued is Frank Ozale, 430 Foster street, Duryea.

Fall of Rock Fatal

Deputy Coroner Charles E. Howell of Pittston, said Swierczenski died instantly under the crushing fall of rock that tumbled down when the runaway cars knocked out timber supports. He said the other two men were trapped for two hours.

Swierczenski, a resident of Duryea for 30 years was a member of Holy Rosary Polish Church, Duryea, and several of the parish societies.
