Neck broken by being struck by the empty trip, he being in the dark; his lamp having gone out sometime previous.
 Ribs broken, penetrating the lungs, caused by the wagon jumping from the track and knocking out the post that was supporting the timber overhead, thereby causing it to fall upon him with the above result. He extricated himself from the fall and spoke, but only lived a few minutes.
 Killed instantly by a fall of roof. His brother was standing close by watching the roof as he was digging out a stump of coal which was twelve feet back of Ills break-row. They had drawn most of their former break-row, and then attempted to dig out the stump of coal, which proved to be a trap.
